

Adjective

Describes a noun. It tells you something about the noun.(what kind, how many, which one)

Adverb

Usually describes a verb. It tells you how something is done. (how, when, where, and why)

Article

introduces a noun.

Conjunction

Joins two words, phrases or sentences together.

Examples of conjunctions

and, but, or, so, because

Interjection

Unusual word, stands alone. expresses emotion or surprise. followed by an exclamation mark.

List of adverbs

slowly, intelligently,
well, yesterday,
tomorrow, here,
everywhere

List of articles.

the,a,an

List of interjections.

Ouch!, Hello!,
Hurray!, Oh no!, Ha!

List of nouns

cowboy, theatre,
box, thought, tree,
kindness, arrival

| Noun | A person, place, thing, idea, living creature, quality, or action |
| preposition | It usually comes before a noun or a pronoun or noun phrase. It joins the noun to some other part of the sentence. |

Pronoun

Used instead of a noun, to avoid repeating the noun.

These are adjectives

big, yellow, thin, amazing, beautiful, quick, important

Verb

Describes an action (doing something) or a state (being something).

When do you use the article "a"?

Before a noun that begins with a consonant.

When do you use the article "an"?

Before a noun that begins with a vowel.
