Academic Recovery	Hinsdale Middle High School Middle School Skill Set is scheduled daily this year for all students in grades six through eight for identification of learning gaps with targeted instruction or potential enrichment, based on individual student needs with flexible grouping for the targeted instruction. Intervention strategies for middle and high school students will be applied through a middle school learning lab, high school assisted study for students with IEPs, and regular education study hall with assistance from interventionists as needed. A late bus will be provided this year to enable more students to stay after school for help from their teachers. The late bus will pick up students at 4:15 from the middle/high school. Homework Club, or Hinsdale After School Program (HASP) for middle school, provides an opportunity for our students to have assistance with homework, and may support addressing the needs of students based on State Assessment Reports. Parents may register student for HASP. Hinsdale Elementary School Students of concern were identified last spring and invited to participate in summer school. The academic and emotional needs of these students will be reviewed by grade level teams prior to the start of the school year. This year a "push-in" model will be used providing support from both Title 1 staff and special education case managers. The model will allow for small group instruction targeted to meet the needs of individual students in reading and language arts. Once fully trained the literacy interventionist will support students one on one to meet their needs based on support from the Literacy Coach. Plans for after school tutoring in math are underway in collaboration with the after school program. Letters have already been sent home to families informing them of the service. In addition, we have an opportunity to work with Alan Gong on developing tutoring programs for individual students in math at the primary level. For our youngest children the behavioral support program will be in pla

A. Athletic Plan

COVID-19 Return to Sports- FALL

ACTION PLAN:

This document provides guidelines set in place that must be followed by all personnel. Anyone found not to be following these guidelines may be suspended from athletic activities.

Team Benches:

- Keep spectator bleachers on players' sideline for social distancing while on the bench.
- Signs will be put in place to remind athletes of social distancing
- Sports bags/backpacks will be lined up against the fence; bags spaced 3ft apart
 - o Bags can only be accessed by their owner
 - o Signs will be put in place to designate baggage area
- Touchless hand sanitizer will be provided at benches and center line

Ball Holders:

- No ball holders
- Extra game balls will be placed in corners and at the center line
- Balls cleaned and disinfected after each event

Game manager:

Enforces social distancing

Spectators:

- Social distancing outside of household members
- Signs will be put in place to remind spectators of social distancing
- Spectators must bring their own seating
- Touchless hand sanitizer provided at entrances to field
 - o If possible, create entrances and exits to the field

Facilities:

Locker Rooms:

- May be used for:
 - Changing
 - Showering
 - Toilet use
- o Hand sanitizer will be placed at the entrances of each locker room
 - Encouraged to use when entering and exiting the locker room
- o Locker rooms will be cleaned and disinfected daily
- Weight Room

- o Can be used when:
 - Social distancing can be maintained consistently at 3ft
 - Equipment is thoroughly cleaned after each use
 - Only clean equipment can be placed back on the racks
- Hand sanitizer will be provided in weight room
 - Encouraged to use when entering and exiting the weight room
- Weight room will be cleaned and disinfected daily
- Athletic Training Room
 - Can be used for:
 - Evaluation of a single athlete
 - One other adult may be in the room if the door needs to be closed, for liability purposes
 - Taping/wrapping of a single athlete
 - One other adult may be in the room if the door needs to be closed, for liability purposes
 - Rehabilitation of a single athlete
 - o Hand sanitizer will be provided in athletic training room
 - o Athletic training room will be cleaned and disinfected daily
 - Treatment table will be cleaned and disinfected after every use

Travel:

- Masks will be required on all bus trips
- Staff and volunteers should not transport any athlete that is not an immediate family member
 - If transportation is necessary, all parties must:
 - Wear a mask
 - Space out seating to maintain maximum distance between each other
- Away Competition:
 - o If someone has a symptoms of Covid-19, they will be asked to leave and return home to self-isolate
 - Call parent/guardian
 - Athlete will be quarantined in an isolated area until they can leave
 - Space out seating to maintain maximum distance between each other

Training Sessions:

- When possible, maintain social distancing
- Mouth-based activities that normally occur during competition are no longer allowed, these include but are not limited to:
 - Spitting
 - Chewing gum
 - Licking fingers
 - Chewing/spitting sunflower seeds

• Staff/volunteers will bring trash bags to pick up any trash following training sessions

Reports of COVID-19:

- Athletics will follow the same reporting and quarantine rules that are accepted for the schools themselves
- If a player on a team has tested positive, that team will follow the quarantine guidelines set forth by the reopening plan for the schools.

- Games:

COVID-19 Return to Winter Sports 2021-2022

ACTION PLAN:

This document provides guidelines set in place that must be followed by all personnel. All players and coaches must sign a waiver agreeing to these guidelines in order to participate in a fall sport. In the event these guidelines are not followed, the Hinsdale School Board has full rights to suspend all athletic activities.

Home Team:

• All home team personnel must practice social distancing and wear masks.

Visiting Team:

• All visiting team personnel must practice social distancing and wear masks.

Team Benches:

- Set up chairs for team 3' apart, following the format of the 2020-2021 season
- Each player gets their own chair and will remain in that chair for the duration of the contest.

Officials Table:

- Home team can provide one score keeper and one timekeeper
 - One person will be designated to keep time and score
 - o Scoreboard remote will be sanitized after each event
- Masks are required
- Visiting team personnel are not essential and will not be asked to keep score

Game manager:

• Enforces social distancing, hand sanitation, and masks

Spectators:

- Social distancing outside of household members
- Masks are required
 - o Unless the spectator is under the age of two years old
- Signs will be put in place to remind spectators of social distancing and to wear masks
- Touchless hand sanitizer provided at entrances to Court
 - o If possible, create entrances and exits to the Court
- Each athlete will be given 4 tickets to each home contest.
- Games will be live streamed at Hinsdale Middle/High school for those whom may not attend in person.
- Visiting teams will be allowed 2 fans per player.

Equipment:

- Cloth face masks are allowed
- Gloves are allowed
- Long sleeves are allowed
- Long pants are allowed, if worn they must be tight-fitting and must be worn under the shorts
- Under garments are allowed, if worn they must be a school color
- Mouth guards are no longer required since 2020
 - o If an athlete would like to wear a mouth guard, they must leave the mouth guard in their mouth as much as possible
 - When not being used it needs to be put in a case
 - Mouth guards should only be touched by their owner
 - o Athlete must use hand sanitizer after touching their mouth guard
- Balls will be provided and sanitized after each event

Facilities:

- Locker Rooms:
 - o May be used for:

- Changing
- Showering
- Toilet use
- o Hand sanitizer will be placed at the entrances of each locker room
 - Encouraged to use when entering and exiting the locker room
- Locker rooms will be cleaned and disinfected daily
- Weight Room
 - o Can be used when:
 - Social distancing can be maintained consistently at 6 ft.
 - Equipment is thoroughly cleaned after each use
 - Only clean equipment can be placed back on the racks
 - o Hand sanitizer will be provided in weight room
 - Encouraged to use when entering and exiting the weight room
 - Weight room will be cleaned and disinfected daily
- Athletic Training Room
 - o Can be used for:
 - Evaluation of a single athlete
 - One other adult may be in the room if the door needs to be closed, for liability purposes
 - All parties must wear a mask
 - NOTE: The athlete is exempt if the injury is suspected to involve the cardiac or respiratory system
 - Taping/wrapping of a single athlete
 - One other adult may be in the room if the door needs to be closed, for liability purposes
 - Rehabilitation of a single athlete
 - o Hand sanitizer will be provided in athletic training room
 - o Athletic training room will be cleaned and disinfected daily
 - Treatment table will be cleaned and disinfected after every us

Travel:

- Staff and volunteers should not transport any athlete that is not an immediate family member
 - o If transportation is necessary, all parties must:
 - Wear a mask
 - Space out seating to maintain maximum distance between each other
- Away Competition:
 - Masks are required
 - Space out seating to maintain maximum distance between each other

Training Sessions:

- When possible, maintain social distancing
- Face masks are required
- Staff/volunteers will bring trash bags to pick up any trash following training sessions

Hydration:

- Adequate water breaks should be provided
 - o Encouraged to occur between changes in training activities
 - o Equipment should be sanitized during these breaks
- Sharing of water bottles is prohibited
- Water coolers and shared water bottles will not be provided
- Water bottles should be brought by each athlete and should be kept with their bag when not being used

Reports of COVID-19:

- AD will call opposing AD if an athlete from the team has tested positive for COVID-19
- Following the report of close contact of someone suspected/confirmed with COVID-19:
 - Symptomatic persons should be instructed to contact their health care provider to be tested for COVID-19 and self-isolate at home
 - Asymptomatic persons reporting that in the past 14 days they have had close contact with someone suspected or confirmed with COVID-19, or who report one of the traveled-related risk factors should self-quartile for 14 days from their last exposure
 - NOTE: Healthcare workers caring for COVID-19 patients while wearing appropriate personal protective equipment should answer "no" when asked if they have had close contact with someone suspected/confirmed with COVID-19.
- If someone with suspect or confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19 must stay home until symptom-based criteria are met for discontinuation of isolation:
 - o At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared

AND

o At least 3 days (72 hours) have passed since recovery

Plans for Participation

• Games:

- o Masks are required when not actively participating
- o Home Game Procedures: Refer to Home Team and Visiting Team
- o Away Game Procedures: Refer to Travel, Away Competition
- o Home games will be held at Hinsdale Middle/High School's Gymnasium
 - Venue may only be used by two schools at a time

Contact Tracing, Isolation, and Quarantine

- People who are diagnosed with COVID-19 must still isolate at home until they have met criteria for discontinuation of isolation
- •Close household contacts of someone diagnosed with COVID-19 will be required to quarantine (e.g., people living or sleeping in the same household) if they are unvaccinated or not up-to-date on their vaccinations see above links
- •In an outbreak situation, NH DPHS may choose to expand quarantine to other non-household contacts to control the outbreak
- •Quarantine of an entire classroom will no longer be conducted
- •Non-household contacts will be asked to self-observe and monitor for symptoms
- •This increases the importance of identifying, excluding, and testing people who develop viral infection symptoms

To complete COVID-19 testing, the patient or guarantor (for those under 18 or unable to sign a consent) consents to the release of their information to this school, Convenient MD Urgent Care who is providing Medical Director oversight of this test administration, and the NH Department of Health and Human Services. By signing this consent, the patient or guarantor consents to obtainment of the specimen for Rapid Antigen COVID -19 testing at the Hinsdale School District.
