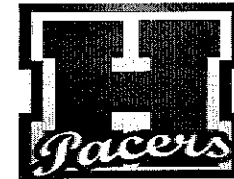
NH Scholars Program

Community:

Hinsdale Middle High School is in the southwestern corner of New Hampshire in Cheshire County. Hinsdale has a population of approximately 4,000 people. Hinsdale is home to Pisgah State Park in the northeast and part of the Wantastiquet Mountain State Forest in the northwest. Both the Ashuelot River and the Connecticut River run through Hinsdale.

School:

Hinsdale Middle/High School is a Middle-Senior School with approximately 280 students enrolled in grades 6-12. There are 40 full and part time faculty members with an average class size of 12 students. The class of 2023 had 30 seniors graduate with 36% going on to postsecondary education, 60% entering the workforce and another 4% going into Trade School.
