- Purpose:** The purpose of the "Moran Family Scholarship" is in recognition of the entire Moran family, Thomas F. Moran, LLS, wife Marge, and daughters, June and Joyce, for the whole family's involvement in the surveying profession over the past 30 plus years.
- Intention:** This scholarship is intended to provide some help to a deserving NH high school graduating or graduate student enrolled in a college level program leading to a serious education in **surveying or surveying related curriculum**. Past recipient's may apply again, if enrolled in a surveying or surveying related program, and/or apply for one of the other scholarships offered by NHLSF.
- Priorities:** The first priority would be financial need, with a strong likelihood the person would become a surveyor at the end of the program to be the second priority, and grades to be the final priority.
- Deadline:** Applications are mailed to all New Hampshire High Schools by February 1st, and all applications, including transcripts, must be received by **March 31st. Mail to: NHLSF - PO Box 689 - Raymond, NH 03077-0689**. Incomplete applications or applications received after the deadline may not be considered.
- Selection:** Selection will be made by the NHLSF Scholarship Committee and the recipient will be notified by mail.
- Award:** The award will consist of \$1,000 and the recipient will be awarded the scholarship at the New Hampshire Land Surveyors Association's Summer Quarterly, to be held in June, and/or at the High School's year-end awards program.

I understand that the New Hampshire Land Surveyors Foundation requires that the sole use of the scholarship will be for tuition payment unless the NHLSF Board of Trustees approves in writing use of the funds for specific education-related expenses. I hereby certify that, if selected, I will use the scholarship solely for tuition payment or specific-related expenses approved in writing by the NHLSF Board of Trustees and agree to provide verification of the same upon request. ## Surveying Scholarships & Grants

For students in or entering the land surveying or civil engineering field.



The **New Hampshire Land Surveyors Foundation (NHLSF)** would like to invite you to apply for over \$9,000 worth of scholarship assistance. NHLSF is the charitable arm of the [New Hampshire](#)

[Surveyors Association](#), a member of the National Society of Professional Surveyors. NHLSF awards the following scholarships to New Hampshire students each year:

### Fall Applications, due November 1:

- 1. E.N. Roberts Scholarship: up to \$2,000**  
This award is in recognition of Roberts' twin professions of Engineering and Land Surveying, and of his work to improve the profession of Land Surveying in the state of New Hampshire. It is given to a 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, or 4<sup>th</sup>-year student from New Hampshire enrolled in a four-year curriculum in Civil Engineering or a two-year curriculum in Civil Technology or Surveying, who has shown serious interest, capability, and outstanding accomplishment in surveying courses, and who plans to make the profession of land surveying his or her career.
- 2. Allen W. Plumb Scholarship: up to \$2,000**  
This award is in recognition of Plumb's twin professions of Forestry and Land Surveying, and of his work to support the New Hampshire Land Surveyors Association and to improve the profession of Land Surveying in the state of New Hampshire. It is given to a 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, or 4<sup>th</sup>-year student from New Hampshire enrolled in a Forestry program (either a two-year or four-year curriculum) who has shown serious interest, capability, and outstanding accomplishment in surveying courses, and who plans to make the profession of land surveying his or her career.


If you are currently employed in the survey field and would like to increase your technical skills through formal examination or other educational opportunity, NHLSF offers the following:

### R.G. Moynihan Education Fund Grant:

The R. G. Moynihan Education Fund will provide grants to qualified applicants who are technicians employed in the field of surveying, working for members of NHLSA, and desiring to seek additional education to advance their knowledge. The grant is administered by NHLSF based on an application cycle. **The applicant's employer, or sponsor, a NHLSA member, would be required to participate by paying the costs associated with the educational opportunity up front, with the guarantee of reimbursement by NHLSF for one-half of the costs upon the successful completion of the class.**



NHLSF has also adopted this model for providing grant funding for one-half of the application and examination fee for the National Society of Professional Surveyors (NSPS) CST Examination sequence (Levels 1, 2, 3, or 4). Visit [http://www.nhlhf.org](#).

**3. Warner M. Plummer Scholarship: up to \$2,000**  
This award is in recognition of Warner M. Plummer's career exemplifying thoughtful and caring contributions to the profession of Land Surveying. It is given to a 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, or 4<sup>th</sup>-year student from New Hampshire enrolled in a four-year Surveying or Surveying Engineering program at a college or university anywhere in the United States or Canada, who has shown serious interest, capability, and outstanding accomplishment, and who plans to make the profession of land surveying his or her career.

**4. Melvin E. Jenkins Scholarship: up to \$2,000**  
This award is in recognition of Jenkins' twin professions of Forestry and Land Surveying, and of his work to support the New Hampshire Land Surveyors Association and improve the profession of Land Surveying in the state of New Hampshire. It is given to a 2<sup>nd</sup>-year student from New Hampshire enrolled in the Thompson School of Applied Science Forestry program, who has shown serious interest, capability, and outstanding accomplishment in forestry courses, and who plans to make the profession of land surveying his or her career.

In recognition of the entire Moran family, this scholarship is intended to provide some help to a deserving New Hampshire High School graduate enrolled in a college-level program leading to a serious education in surveying or surveying-related curriculum.
